B. Project Narrative Report

1) Overall performance

As a response to the multiple crises in Lebanon, CL and Sponsorship USA decided to launch a project to help vulnerable Lebanese families deal with socio-economic shocks. The purpose of the assistance is to give a sense of stability in vulnerable Lebanese households' daily spending in order to prevent them from falling further into poverty and adopting negative coping mechanisms.

The Cash Assistance allows families to cover a portion of their most pressing expenses. It enables individuals to make their own purchases and put the money toward the most urgent needs, such as utilities and other expenditures. Households (HHs) may have a variety of needs: some may require food, while others may be facing late payments of rent or medical costs. Based on CL's previous experience, this intervention was the most appropriate to help them mitigate their financial burden.

CL has taken all necessary steps and procedures to protect the safety of its staff and, most significantly, the project's beneficiaries during the implementation. Following the completion of the assessments, the selected beneficiaries received an SMS with the transfer number to withdraw their funds from BOB finance. CL adheres to humanitarian inclusion standards for older people and people with disabilities, and is committed to providing assistance and protection based on need and without discrimination. Thus, CL enabled access to the most vulnerable and visited more than 100 people with mobility difficulties to provide them with the assistance. In total, 443 HHs benefitted till March 2022 from the cash assistance.



2) Affected Persons

The project targeted 443 vulnerable (HHs) in the Beirut and Mount Lebanon regions distributed as follow:

163 HHs in Mount Lebanon

121 HHs in the North

61 HHs in the South

31 HHs in Beirut

67 HHs in Beqaa

Considering that the HH is composed of 5 members on average, this project has helped 2,215 individuals.

3) Success stories

- S.K family was able to buy milk and diapers for their children with the cash assistance provided since they weren't able to afford them before and the mother had to lactate for a long period of time instead and use substitutes of diapers which infected the children.
- The cash assistance helped the elderlies of J.BA to afford their different expenses and to provide their daily needs in terms of food and medication.
- J.H family was able to settle part of their children's school tuition as they were in threat of dropping out of school.
- S.H family was able to afford the cost of surgery and the post-surgery treatment, as the member had a life-threatening condition and needed surgery as soon as possible.
- After receiving the cash assistance of the first round, the mother was so relieved that she could satisfy the needs of her children to get basic items of food and proper education. Moreover, she was able to purchase an oven since she was using the traditional method of cooking.
- "It was a tough time for me when my children were requiring something that I could not provide," the mother Rita expresses, "now, I am glad to see the smile of my kids, and I feel overjoyed when I see them go happily to school every morning."
- W.R family was able to settle part of their different debts due and to feel liberated from this stress.
- H.M family was able to afford to pay electricity and the children were able to study in the light as they were using candles and were prohibited of watching TV like other children their age.

- Last year, Charbel, the father became unemployed as the company has to fire several employees due to the economic situation Lebanon is facing. The assistance helped the family to buy food and afford their daily needs.
- Due to the economic situation Lebanon is facing, the landlord of the building had to increase the rent which made N.C family unable to afford to pay the increased amount. They were threatened of eviction and they had nowhere else to go. The assistance supported them in paying the rent for the previous unpaid months and to keep their home.
- The cash assistance was used for livelihood recovery and replacing assets, followed by food and house repairs especially after Beirut blast where several parts of the house were still affected and humidity was all over the house especially in the bedrooms which led E.H family to suffer from many diseases.
- The assistance was urgently needed to buy medicines as Elie, the father was suffering from cancer and needed money to afford the expensive medications and treatment.
- Jamil, the father was able to pay the store's different expenses and rent as he was thinking of closing the store because of the devastating situation Lebanon is facing since the port explosion.
- The head of household of A.B family was unemployed and the cash was a big assistance for him in order to provide his family's daily needs in terms of food and others.
- Since the two elderlies of J.BM family are living alone with no one to take care of them, the cash assistance helped them to afford their different expenses and their daily needs in food and medications.
- The assistance helped the woman in house P.H to live in dignity and afford her basic needs in food and medications in addition to the ability to afford electricity as she was living in the dark as soon as the sun sets.
- J.T family was able to buy milk and diapers for their children with the cash assistance provided since they weren't able to afford them before.
- C.A family was able to settle part of their different debts due and to feel liberated from the stress of being threatened.
- The assistance helped M.J family to afford their children's expenses and to buy them gifts for Christmas Holidays. The kids were happy and excited, a feeling they were missing for a long time.
- Because of the cash assistance, the female head of household R.T was able to purchase fabrics as well as sewing items to start a tailoring and embroidery business and started making clothes.
